

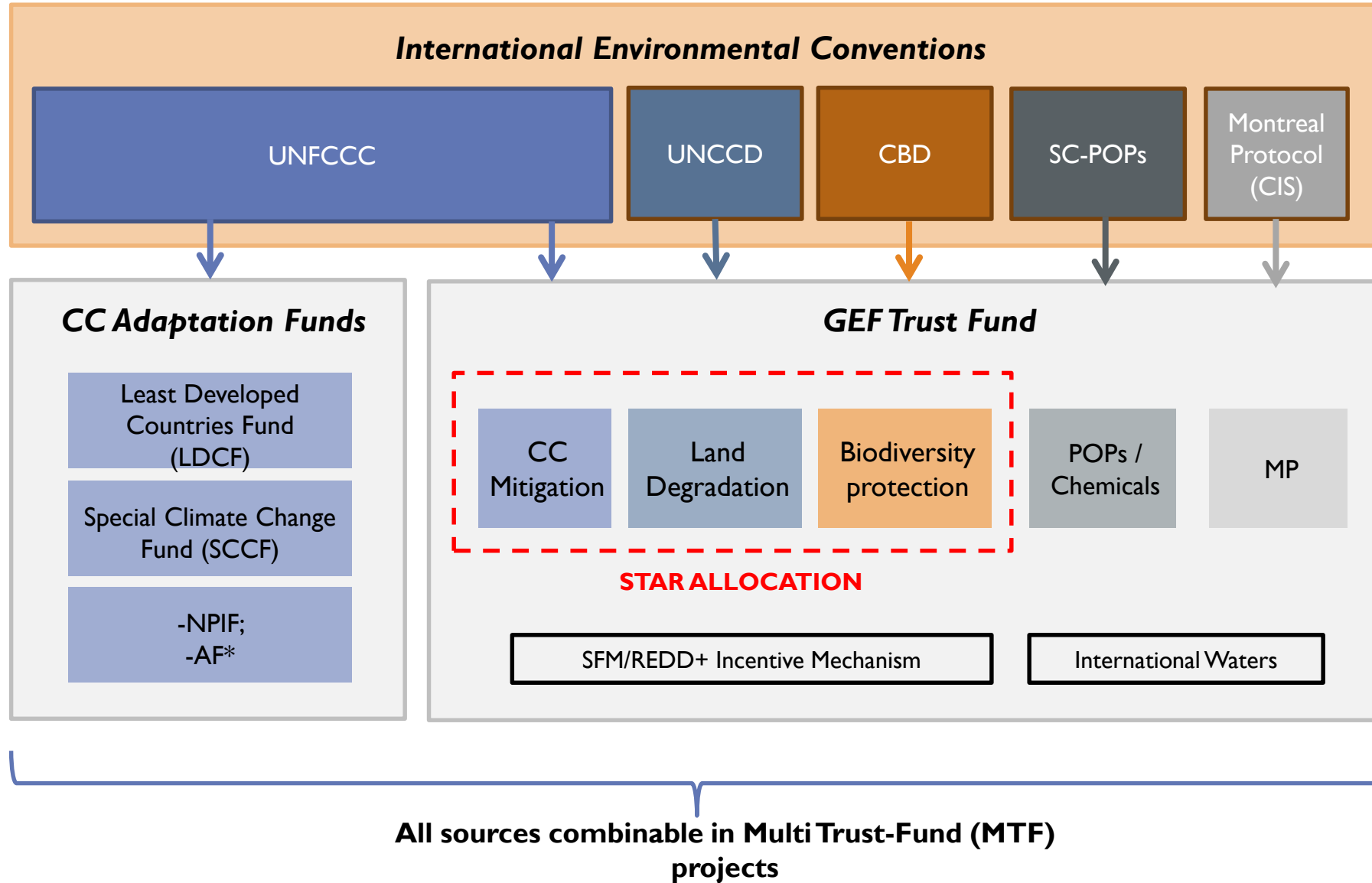


WHAT IS THE GEF AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

Goal and mission

- **Goal:** to address global environmental issues while supporting national sustainable development initiatives.
- **Mission:** the GEF is a mechanism for international cooperation for the purpose of providing new and additional grant and concessional funding to meet the agreed incremental costs of measure to achieve agreed global environmental benefits.

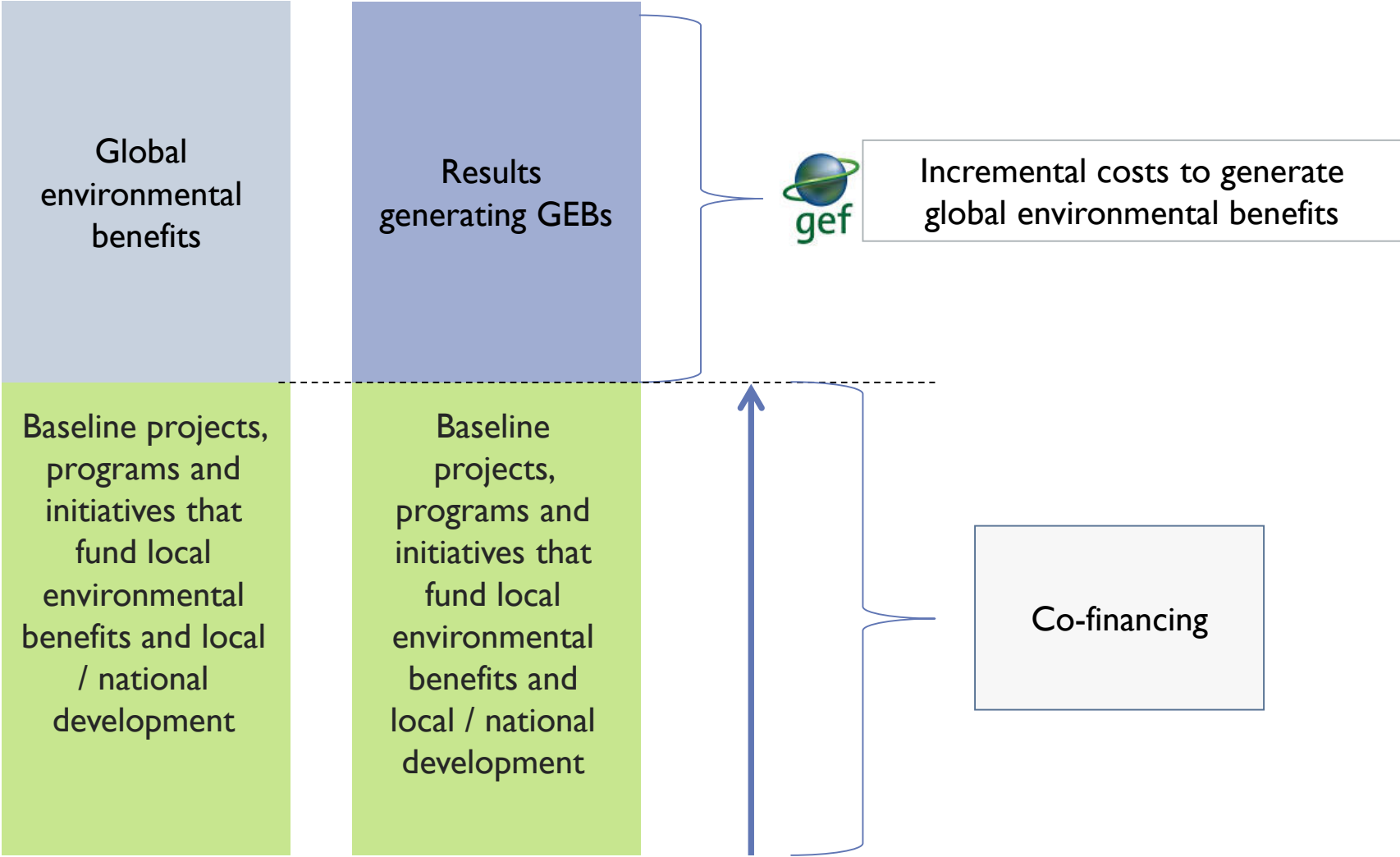

Definition: “resources that are additional to the GEF grant and that are provided by the GEF Partner Agency itself and/or by other non-GEF sources that support the implementation of the GEF-financed project and the achievement of its objectives.”

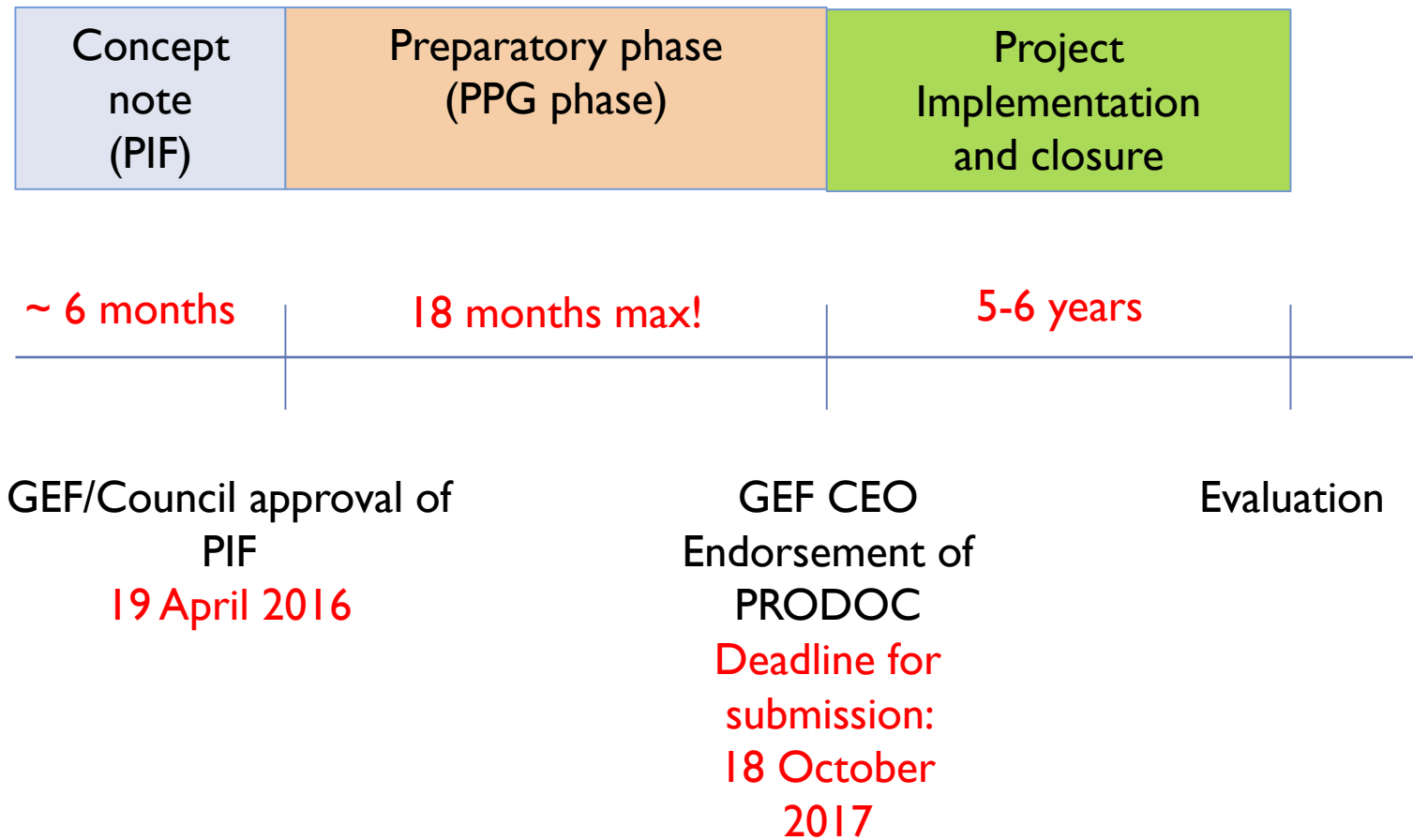

Contribution of Sustainable Forest Management to a Low Emission and Resilient Development

Objective: To promote multifunctional sustainable forest management to conserve biodiversity, enhance and conserve carbon stocks and secure forest ecosystem services in productive forest landscapes

GEF grant: USD 3,274,658

Co-financing: USD 29,960,000



Component I. Enabling environment for multifunctional sustainable forest management

Outcome I.1. Improved decision-making in management of productive forest landscapes

- National forest inventory
- Monitoring, reporting and verification system
- Revision of forestry framework and legislation
- National coordination platform



Component I. Enabling environment for multifunctional sustainable forest management

Outcome I.2 Institutional capacities strengthened for multifunctional forest management

- Staff and stakeholders trained in updated SFM techniques and BD management



Component 2. Multifunctional forest management

Outcome 2.1 Increased forest area under sustainable multi-functional forest management

- Integrated forest development plans
- Implementation of forest management plans
- BD protection and monitoring measures in place
- Forest cover increased



Component 3. Monitoring, Evaluation and dissemination of lessons learned

Outcome 3.1 Adaptive management ensured and key lessons shared

- M&E system and reporting
- Achievements and results recorded and disseminated
